### **UPDATES TO STATE ESSENTIAL HEALTH BENEFITS BENCHMARK PLANS SINCE 2020**




### BACKGROUND

California is considering adoption of a new essential health benefits (EHB) benchmark plan in order to mandate that additional services be covered by plans required to cover EHBs. The state Legislature has requested an overview of other states' EHB benchmark plans to support its review of options.

**11** states and the District of Columbia

requested and received federal approval for EHB-benchmark plans since 2020. Details on approved changes are below.

### ESSENTIAL HEALTH BENEFITS (EHBS) AND CALIFORNIA

The California Legislature is considering the inclusion of chiropractic care, dental care and services for adults, durable medical equipment (e.g., wheelchairs, wigs), hearing aids, and infertility diagnosis and treatments in its EHB benchmark plan beginning in the 2027 benefit year.



## **CHIROPRACTIC CARE**




**45** states and the District of Columbia consider chiropractic care an EHB and include coverage in their EHB benchmark plan. State benefits vary in terms of frequency of coverage, but generally cover between 10 and 40 visits per benefit year.



### **CRANIAL PROSTHESES**




**17** states consider coverage for cranial prostheses an EHB and include it in their EHB benchmark plan. Terms and conditions of coverage vary between states, with some providing coverage only to enrollees who have undergone cancer treatment or who have specified medical conditions (e.g., second or third degree burns, alopecia areata)



### DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT: WHEELCHAIRS



**28** states and the District of Columbia explicitly include wheelchairs as a type of durable medical equipment covered as an EHB under their EHB benchmark plan. Terms and conditions, such as prior authorization and type of wheelchair, may apply. Note that other states may provide coverage for wheelchairs as durable medical equipment however this is not explicitly stated in their EHB benchmark plan.

ADULT Dental




**No** states include routine dental services or basic dental care for adults as benefits in their EHB coverage.

### **HEARING AIDS AND EXAMS**

### **INFERTILITY DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENTS**




**16** states include hearing aids and exams, regardless of enrollee age, in their EHB benchmark plan. 13 states include pediatric hearing aid coverage as EHBs. State benefits vary in terms of frequency of coverage, but generally include an annual exam, and one hearing aid per ear for every 1-3 years of coverage.





**20** states and the District of Columbia consider infertility treatment an EHB and include coverage within their EHB benchmark plan. Covered benefits vary between states. **7** states cover only diagnosis and testing, and may include treatment of the underlying causes of infertility; **1** state covers diagnosis and testing and some prescription drugs for infertility; **8** states extend EHB coverage to artificial insemination; another **5** states and the District of Columbia include these aforementioned benefits and in vitro fertilization as an EHB.
