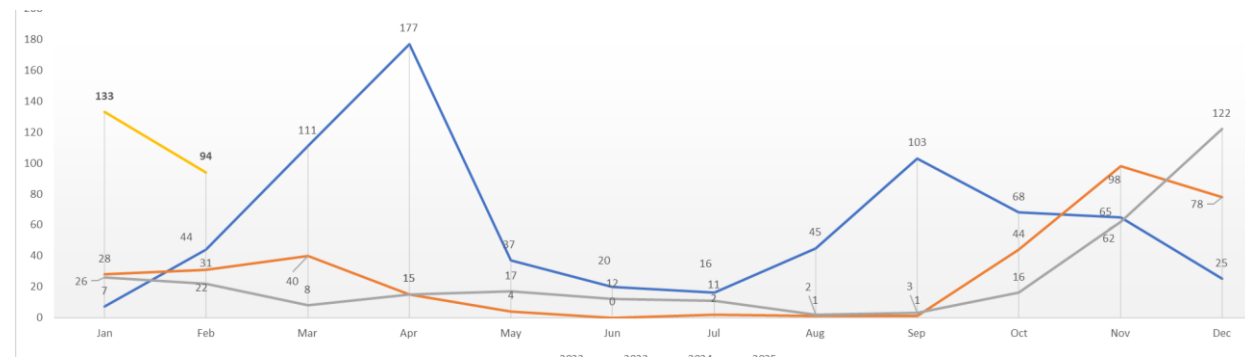
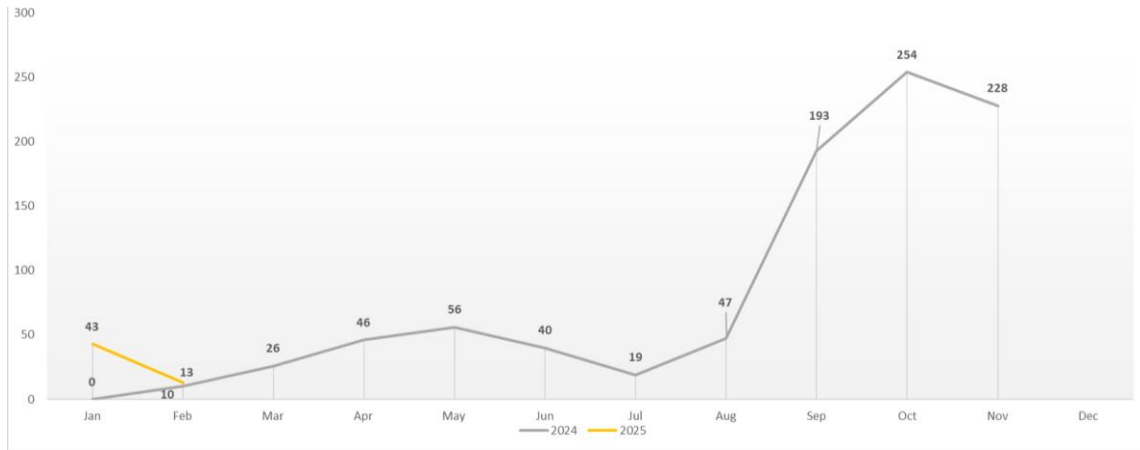

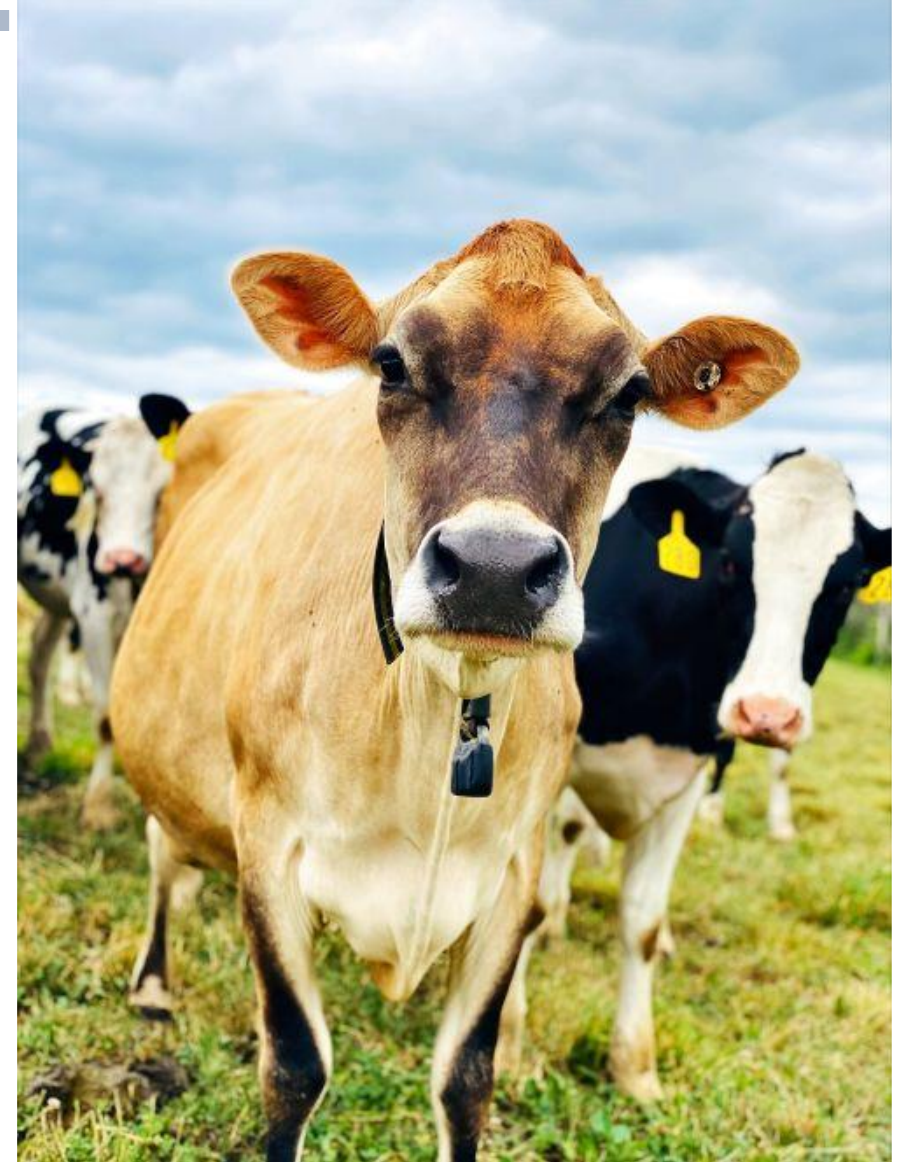

Key Messages

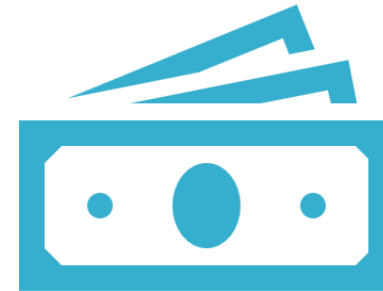
- Biosecurity is key to mitigate the risk of disease spread.
- National surveillance testing is critical to understanding the distribution of the virus to quickly respond and eliminate circulating virus from the nation's livestock and poultry



National Animal Disease Preparedness and Response Program (NADPRP) Increases Collaborative Efforts



NADPRP funds projects led by States, Tribes, livestock producer organizations, universities, and others that enhance local, regional, and national capabilities to prevent, prepare for, and respond to animal disease outbreaks



APHIS has invested over \$55 million to support 255 animal disease preparedness projects over the last 5 years; an additional \$17M is available for new projects in 2025.
